## "MERCY, TENDERNESS, COMPASSIONATE LOVE"

Those very qualities in the lives of the first Christian leaders enabled the early church to welcome "outsiders" and make them feel comfortably at home. The young community looked like Revelation's new Jerusalem, gates facing everywhere, welcoming everyone. Announcing this year's Jubilee Year of Mercy, Pope Francis declared mercy, tenderness, and compassionate love, offered unflinching to all, essential to our identity as Jesus' disciples, crucial for authentic Christian witness. Sadly, wrote Francis, the practice of mercy seems to be waning in our world. But no matter what we experience from others, everyone who meets us should encounter Jesus' mercy. In today's Gospel, on the very night Jesus experienced betrayal, denial, and desertion, he still bequeathed shalom to those about to fail--and to us. Not the world's broken promises and competing self-interests, but Jesus' soul-deep, rock-solid peace, enabling us to survive life's inner pain and outer storms, inviting us to imitate Jesus' own self-sacrifice, giving glory to God, giving life to others.

### Sixth Sunday of Easter

"There arose no little dissension and debate." Did that happen at work this week? Most of us can recall run-ins with coworkers, even with the boss. Did it happen while socializing with friends? Go easy on politics, religion . . . even sports. At home? Even the most peaceful household experiences a little "give and take" now and then. So where was it that "there arose no little dissension and debate"? That tumultuous conflict occurred among our first Christian ancestors, disrupting the community life of the early church. But today's Acts of the Apostles shows how beautifully the Holy Spirit, promised by Jesus in today's Gospel, helped the church achieve a grace-filled resolution. What evolved was that "reconciled diversity," often encouraged by Pope Francis and even envisioned in today's Revelation passage; and a wondrous experience of Jesus' promised Gospel gift: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you."

Through a joint effort of the Diocese of Trenton and Catholic Charities, licensed professional



counselors are available to help parishioners with difficult issues such as bereavement, marital and family problems, elder care, stress of job loss. The service can be accessed by contacting your pastor or parish priest who will provide additional information and a referral.



The fee is \$75 per session. If needed, financial assistance for this short term counseling (up to 6 sessions) is available through the Diocese of Trenton Parish Counseling Services.

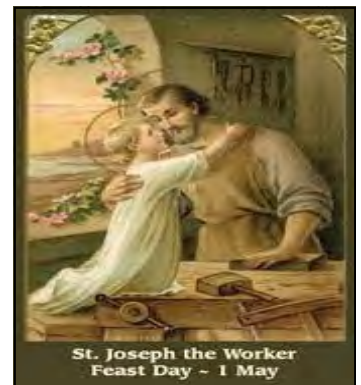
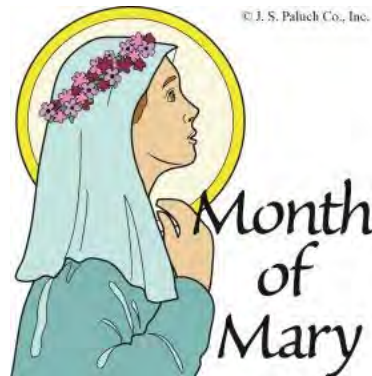

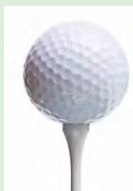
