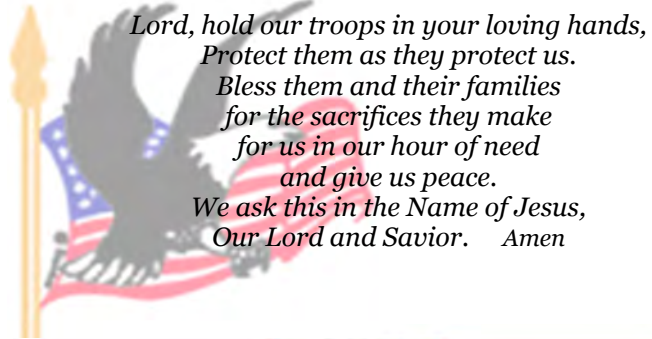

LIVING THE AUTHENTIC LIFE

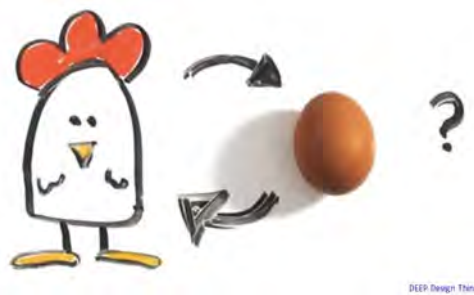
When we fail to live the life given to us by God, we deny the very sacrifice that Jesus made for our salvation. It is easy to see when we fail to live authentically. We sin. We rationalize our choices. We put ourselves first. We are afraid and we are captive to our short-sightedness. How do we know if we are living the life intended for us by God? The life that faith offers is an authentic life rooted in God, whose Son Jesus died and was raised for us. An authentic life reflects the value of what has been given for us, that is, the life of Jesus, sacrificed on the cross. We need only measure our lives by the standards that Jesus' life reflects: we must act justly, love tenderly, and walk humbly with our God (see Micah 6:8). This is all that is asked of us.

The Chicken or the Egg?

The Pharisee in today's Gospel thought he knew who was bad and who was good. He looked at the woman who came to see Jesus and saw a sinner. Jesus saw a loving person who needed forgiveness. "Her many sins have been forgiven because she has shown great love. But the one to whom little is forgiven, loves little" (Luke 7:47). But when Jesus explains this in a parable, he seems to be saying that forgiveness is the cause of love. So which came first, love or forgiveness?



Like the question about the chicken or the egg, the answer is both: forgiveness leads to love for God, but God's love is the source of all forgiveness. Notice how Jesus compares the woman and the Pharisee. By pointing out how little the Pharisee did to welcome Jesus, he reminds the man that he is a sinner, too. But the man doesn't recognize his own sins and so does not ask for forgiveness. That's why the woman experiences Jesus' love, while the Pharisee does not.

Like the chicken or the egg, we might come to see God's love on a retreat or at a parish mission. Touched by that love, we seek forgiveness. On the other hand, we may feel that God is far from us because of our sins, but when we finally get the courage to confess them, we are filled with the joy of freedom from our sins. God loves all sinners, but only the ones who admit it are able to experience that love.

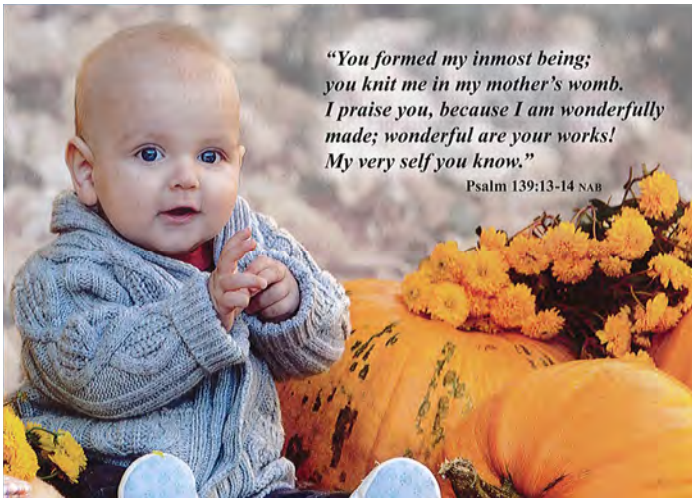

# Quo vadis...

---

My Dear Parishioners: Today we celebrate the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. The story of the sinful woman who bathed Jesus' feet with her tears, dried them with her hair, covered them with kisses, and anointed them is one of the best known in the whole of Sacred Scripture. In our day, interpreters have endeavored to apply it, without qualification, as a proof of the primacy of "love". The important thing for us here is the parable that Jesus speaks to his host when the latter doubts the prophetic powers of a man who does not seem to realize what kind of woman has approached him. The point of the parable is that the woman is forgiven much because she has shown great love; one who shows little love is not thus forgiven. The woman's love has been shown in the way she approached Jesus. It is for that reason that he tells her, "Your sins are forgiven".

We have begun the Liturgical Season of Ordinary Time. We have changed the vestments from a festive white or gold to green which is the color of hope. The chalices used are silver, the bell used for the consecration is a less solemn tone, the service music for the Mass is much simpler to reflect the season. The chant used for the service music comes from the Revised Roman Missal and is considered to be the common text and tone for all Roman Catholics in the English speaking world. It is especially nice for the summertime since it is not elongated with many repetitions. Some parents have given positive feedback since the text of the Gloria are sung by the entire congregation rather than antiphonally with the cantor/choir singing the verses. Some of the parents mentioned that it

was difficult teaching their children that prayer when the congregation does not sing the text. This season continues until the 34th Sunday which is the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Here in our parish, we adjust the service music during the Month of September to keep things interesting and prayerful. Many thanks to all those who work so very hard behind the scenes to make our worship reverent and lively.

Our 7th Annual Parish Golf Outing has been a great success. There were many who gave generously of their time and talent to announce and organize this event. It is a major source of financial revenue for our parish. Thanks to The Raymond Family and all of our Sponsors; to the Golfers; to those who participated in the Summer Social. This Golf Outing was overseen and coordinated by Bill Lenahan & Deacon Sorrentino and their committee; the Summer Social by Monica Barr and her committee. Thank You!

As the summer begins, it is important that we not lose sight of celebrating Mass each weekend. As school sessions end, vacations are taken, schedules are less regular...our Christian Discipleship needs to be nourished weekly by the celebration of Mass and regular reception of Holy Communion. Our parish church buildings are equipped with air-conditioning and we use these climate control systems whenever needed. Please plan your personal comportment accordingly.
