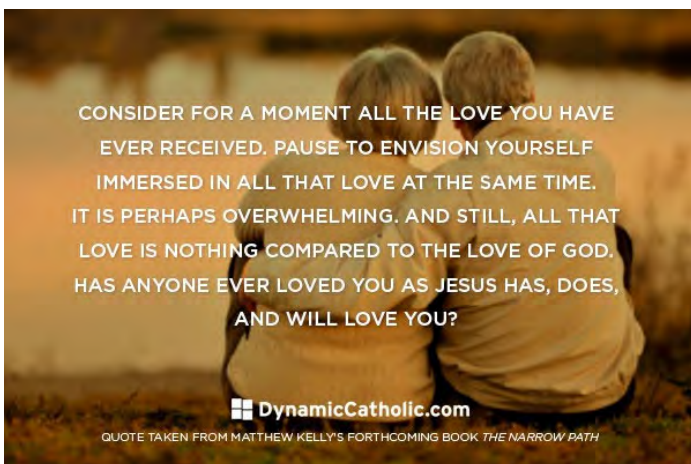

**HOPE AND LIFE**

Today's readings tell the story of two widows. The first reading relates the plight of the widow with whom the prophet Elijah stayed; the Gospel tells about the widow of Nain. In each story, the widow's only son had died. For people who lived in those cultures, the son was the only support of a widow, and the carrying on of the family name by the son was equal to immortality. A widow whose only son has died could lose all hope.

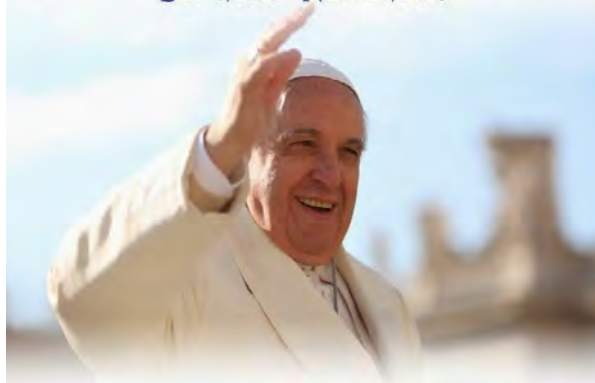
Elijah and Jesus are the restorers of hope; they bring the sons back to life. Saint Paul was metaphorically raised from the dead when he experienced the conversion and call from God that he describes in today's second reading.

What are Christians called to do today? We may not be able to raise the dead, but perhaps we can rekindle hope for a single parent. We may not be able to convert a persecutor like Paul, but if we speak the gospel openly and gently with our lives, we might touch a life with the Good News.

**JUBILEE OF MERCY**

DEC. 8, 2015 - NOV. 20, 2016

**Jubilee Year of Mercy***Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Half the liturgical year 2016 is completed after six months of extraordinary celebrations. The Incarnation mystery: Jesus' advent, nativity, epiphany. The Paschal mystery: Jesus' passion, death, resurrection, Pentecost's Holy Spirit. The solemnities of Holy Trinity and Jesus' Body and Blood. Today the Church resumes Sundays in Ordinary Time, but with a Gospel of extraordinary mercy: Jesus raises a dead man to life. Yet the one who benefits most from his extraordinary mercy is not the dead son but his widowed mother. With

her husband and only son deceased, this woman's material support, in that patriarchal society, had vanished. So had her emotional support, leaving her helpless, abandoned, on society's "peripheries." One of Pope Francis' hopes in calling this Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy is to transform us into more extraordinary Christians, by making our caring outreach to just such vulnerable people, and our practical self-sacrificing love for them, our ordinary, daily, Christian way of life!

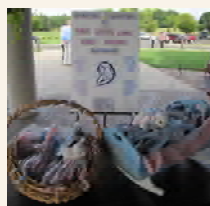
### BABY SHOWER *Your Invited!!* LET'S CELEBRATE on June 12

My Dear Parishioners: Today we celebrate the Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel selection from the Community of Luke reminds us of the important focus each disciple needs to cultivate: compassion for the poor and needy and Jesus as the fulfillment of the prophets through the ages. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, Jesus reveals his identity through his actions. Jesus, the Spirit and the Father are one substance, a communion of love. The Church is called to be the living communion of this love in our world today by accepting Jesus' call to provide for the needs of the poor, alienated and marginalized in our midst. The liturgy that we celebrate today reminds us that we live in the age of the Spirit sent by God through Jesus.

The month of June is filled with lots of activities. This coming Monday is our Annual Parish Golf Outing & Summer Social sponsored by Slate Professional Resources, Inc. - The Raymond Family. We are grateful to Deacon Sorrentino and Bill Lenahan and their committee for overseeing the Golf Outing & Monica Barr and her committee for overseeing the details of our Summer Social. This is an important event in the life of our parish. We celebrate the great community we have and we raise needed funds for us to continue the work of the Church. These funds, over and above our Weekly Stewardship, help us to retire some of our liabilities while at the same time renewing our facilities to provide for the needs of our community. Registrations for our Summer Intensive Religious Education modules is now closed. Enrollment continues to climb each year. Orientations are scheduled for those participating families. Let us continue to support these children and their

families with the very best we can offer so that they grow in their faith and live that faith in a lively way.

We continue our participation in the Faith in Our Future Project. Our co-hort consists of four parishes: Saint Gabriel, Marlboro; Saint Catharine, Holmdel; Saint Benedict, Holmdel and Saint Mary, Colts Neck. The assessments have been fair and open. This weekend, six were ordained priests for service in the Diocese of Trenton. I believe that there are eight new seminarians entering the seminary this fall. This weekend, I will participate in the ordination rites at our Diocesan Cathedral, Trenton. I will fly to Chicago for a 36 hour stay participating in my classmate and long-time friend's 25th Anniversary of Priestly Ordination at the parish he serves in Michigan City, Indiana. Monsignor Troiano will be in Buffalo, NY celebrating with His Excellency, Bishop Edward U. Kmiec his 80th Birthday. The Martha Mary Guild had a wonderful first-hand acquaintance with the bees on May 11. Thanks to Drew Madzin, son of our member, Pauline Madzin, and owner of "From the Garden" in Freehold, our May meeting was not only fun, but very informative. One just doesn't realize all there is to making natural honey. So much depends on the "plight of the bees". Pesticides, predators and weather are big factors in the process. Drew and his assistant, Jess Sinkhorn, were with us the whole afternoon and still refused to accept an honorarium.
