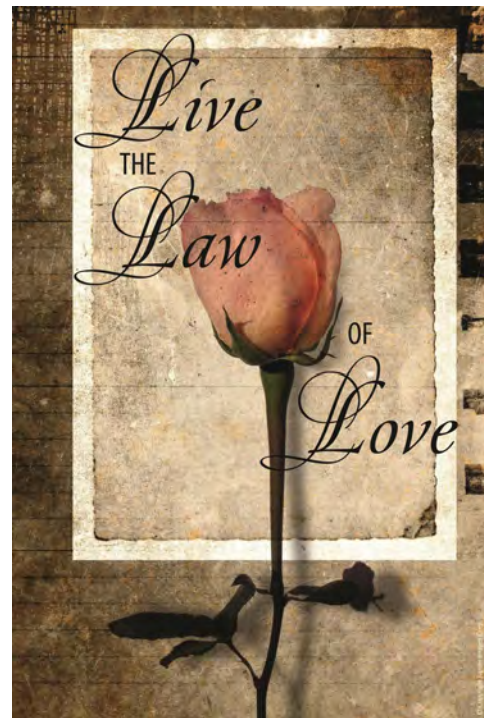

Moses tells us that God's law is very near to us, already in our mouths and hearts--in our very DNA, we might say. But sometimes we feel lost, confused, and exhausted. Although God imprints the law in our hearts, we don't always know confidently how to behave in certain situations. And then there are the times when we probably do know the wisest, most loving course of action, but we make unhealthy choices. Jesus knows this, and loves us anyway. He tells us the parable of the good Samaritan to encourage us. The scholar of the law questioning Jesus describes the Samaritan as one who acts "with mercy." He is a perceptive scholar, and Jesus approves of his responses. Like the scholar, we recognize goodness when we see it. But sometimes we push goodness to the margins of our lives, reserving it for Sundays or special occasions. God's law, filled with goodness and mercy, cannot be confined. During this Jubilee Year of Mercy, we are reminded that our call is to act with mercy at all times, at home, in business, online, and in daily interactions with people we might not like all that much or who treat us badly. "Go and do likewise," Jesus tells us. We can have complete confidence that Jesus will give us the strength we need.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The first "presbyters" were advisers to the bishops rather than what we would call "priests," yet by the year 1000 our present-day understanding of the ordained priesthood is clearly in place. The Germanic influence was strong in those days, reflected in a series of questions posed to the candidate about his intentions. The priest's role in the celebration of Mass had by then come to the fore, as the ritual notes that Mass vestments must be worn, the hands of the priest must be anointed with chrism, and a chalice with wine and water and a paten with a host must be given. Up to then, the ordination rite had stressed the presbyter as a collaborator



with the bishop and a member of the order of presbyters. Then, in a not-so-subtle shift, the presbyter came to be seen as a "priest" designated to celebrate the Mass and, as the prayer suggests, to touch the chalice. By these days, remember, the cup had long vanished from Communion for the laity. A thousand years ago, today's patterns were already in place. The priest no longer saw himself as a member of a council of elders, a presbytery, and in some dioceses he had little influence over the bishop. Instead, he was either a pastor, with relationship to the Eucharistic community in the parish, or he was a priest monk, offering Mass for the salvation of the departed or the intentions of the living. --Rev. 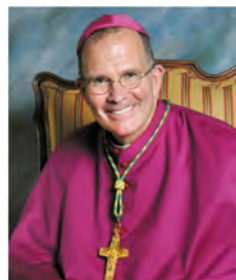

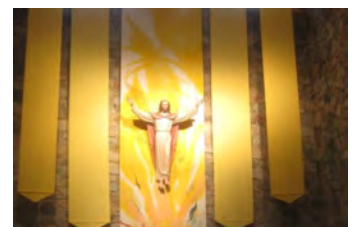

Quo vadis...

My Dear Parishioners: Today we celebrate the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Our reflection on this Sunday's gospel isn't really setting up an opposition between keeping the law and doing good for others. Probably in our society and Church today we need to become more aware of the value of keeping laws. Our reflection does alert us to the fact that keeping laws alone isn't enough. All our actions are directed to the good of others and the furthering of God's kingdom. Keeping laws promotes good order in any community; doing good for others promotes right relationships in those same communities. Law is something external to us, rather easily measured. Mercy and compassion are internal to us and can be measured only in terms of the good we actually do for others. Laws are internalized when they are kept for the sake of others. We are to do as the Samaritan in the parable: let the law of mercy and compassion gain for us eternal life.

I hope that each of you had an opportunity to slow down and reflect on the gift of Freedom that we enjoy as we observed Independence Day. It certainly was a hot week. There was a nice attendance here for Mass. Last week, I wrote about some of the changes to our parish staffing. This week, I would like to recognize and highlight the growing number of those parishioners who are sharing their time and talent by volunteering in our parish office and helping to support our parish staff members. These dozens of volunteers are enabling us to continue to serve you better. Additionally, they are helping us to begin to organize our parish records and archives into a usable system both electronic and paper. This will take several years for us to complete. Thanks to our Community Building team for coordinating these efforts.

Preparations are underway for our Annual Super 50/50. This year as we continue to be more

compliant with civil statutes, we will be offering the tickets online. This will save us much time, printing, postage, etc. We will offer assistance to all those who do not have access to the internet at home. I know that this adjustment sounds way outside the box; however, I ask that you be open to this process as we strive to continue our success while remaining compliant with civil ordinances and statutes. More details will be forthcoming in the parish bulletin, website, as well as through email communication. Thank you for your openness and cooperation along the way.

As we prepare for returning to *Standard Time* this coming fall. It has been suggested that we consider celebrating the Saturday Evening Mass at 4:00 pm for those months when we celebrate the Sunday Evening Mass at 5:00 pm. There are several reasons for us to consider this. First, there are some among us who struggle with driving in the darkness of winter and because of medication, have difficulties in the morning. Second, the time change will assist families, especially those with smaller children, to be home in a timely manner to prepare dinner so that children can get to bed. Thirdly, some mentioned that they could now make the "early bird specials"...*ok?* I have informally consulted a random selection of parishioners who supported this as a trial for the *Standard Time* period this year and then evaluate whether or not it should be continued. I have consulted with our Parish Pastoral Council, Staff, Trustees and all were in favor of "giving it a try." I thought that it would be prudent to introduce this now so that we can all prepare for this adjustment beginning November 2016. Please know that we are striving to serve you in the best possible way. Thank you for your openness to this schedule change. Have a great week. Let us remember one another in prayer. Happy Sunday.
