

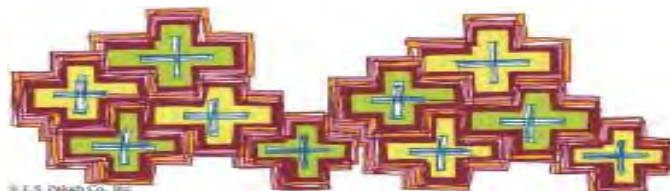

PEACE

The greeting of peace at Mass adds substance to a message of today's readings: peace is relational. When we greet in peace the person near us at Mass, we share the touch of a handshake or embrace, sincere eye contact, and friendly words. The scriptures speak of a similar peace. The first reading from Isaiah describes the peace of the holy city, Jerusalem, a place of prosperity and comfort where the "LORD's power shall be known to his servants" (Isaiah 66:14c). The Christian understanding of peace changes slightly. Paul writes of the "peace and mercy" on all who are created anew. Jesus describes a feeling of peace that will rest on those who accept his disciples and their message. Peace is both an absence of strife and a personal blessing. May we always and sincerely bring peace to our own lives as we share it with others. Copyright (c) J. S. Paluch Co.



MAY I NEVER BOAST

EXCEPT IN THE CROSS OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST

DEEPLY CONNECTED

We are never alone, not really. We live in relationships, in community. That's the way we come into the world, after all, with a mother laboring to deliver us into the human community. God--being Father, Son, Holy Spirit--is a mysterious community who intends us to live in relationship with God and others, always and forever. Stories of abandonment or abuse affect us strongly precisely because we all know the deep human need to be embraced by a loving family. Our reading from Isaiah today describes God as a gentle mother, playing with us, her children, and comforting us. This same God who cares for us so intimately chose to enter our human family through Mary. Jesus, her son, grew strong in her care. And, as Luke tells us today, when the time came to spread his gospel message, Jesus insisted on community: he sent his disciples in pairs. The instructions Jesus gives his seventy-two missionaries reinforce the importance of community. Jesus wants his disciples to build healthy relationships wherever they go, wishing peace on new acquaintances, sharing gifts of healing and faith, and graciously accepting hospitality in whatever form it is offered. Quo vadis...

My Dear Parishioners: Today we celebrate the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In our own times we are not so conscious of personified evil as in the time of Jesus. Demons represent a worldview; God's kingdom breaks in on this evil and establishes a new world order in which evil's grasp is broken. The establishment of God's reign is already an in-breaking of the final glory that will be ours—our “names are [already] written in heaven.” References to the abundance of the end times are captured in the “harvest” metaphor Jesus uses. Jesus looks at the harvest and sees abundance, fulfillment. Some of this abundance and fulfillment is surely realized in our own taking up of Jesus' mission to bring peace, heal, and dispel evil. The challenge of the gospel is that we don't get so lost in doing Jesus' mission that we forget being disciples—ambassadors—of Christ is in itself already an in-breaking of God's reign. It is in Christ's presence through us that peace and joy are spread. Living the paschal mystery means believing in what God has made us—ambassadors of Christ, members of his body. It means that we are as satisfied with the presence we bring as we are with the good that we can do. Mission is being sent to be Christ for others. Only when we act out of our identity can anything we do help establish God's reign.

This week we, as Americans, celebrate Independence Day. It is a great time for us to reflect on the many gifts and blessings we have received from those who have gone before us. Let us continue to pray for our Religious Liberty as a cornerstone of our social order. Mass will be celebrated 9am in the church on Independence Day. It is a great way to begin the celebration. Come, join us and invite some of your family and friends to our community worship. Independence Day reminds us that we are well into the summer months. Hard to comprehend that 2016 is half over! Where does the time go? Take time to make the most of the summer months. We have

had some very beautiful days and evenings to enjoy walks in the town parks or even here on the church property.

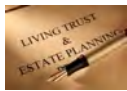
Effective 30 June 2016 Joe Noble has retired from our parish staff and Marianne Lane has begun employment in Lawrenceville, NJ. Gared Walters, hired in April as part-time Coordinator for Facilities will continue in that role. The Support Staff position has not yet been filled as we evaluate the needs and how best to address them. We wish them both well in their new endeavors. Effective 1 July there are some staffing re-alignments that are happening. Deacon Rinaldi will be assuming greater responsibilities on our Faith Formation Team, particularly with the Confirmation Preparation process. He will work closely with Michele McCue. Deacon Rinaldi will retain some responsibilities overseeing our Parish Liturgical Life. Andrew Macirowski, currently our parish organist, will serve part-time as Pastoral Coordinator for Worship assuming some of the responsibilities that were currently overseen by Deacon Rinaldi while continuing as the parish organist. Father Victor Hoagland, CP continues to serve our parish one time per month as his schedule, and, in the winter months as the weather permits. We are so very grateful to Father Victor. Monsignor Troiano has settled into our parish these past 5 months or so. Thank you for being so very welcoming to him as he transitions into “retirement”. We strive to provide staffing to serve the needs of our parish while at the same time adhere to a constrained budget given our current revenue and liabilities. Many thanks to all of our parishioners and benefactors for your generous and sacrificial stewardship to support the mission of the church here in our parish. May God continue to reward you for your commitment to Christ and the Church. Have a great week. Let us remember one another in prayer. Happy Sunday. Peace. Father Jeff
