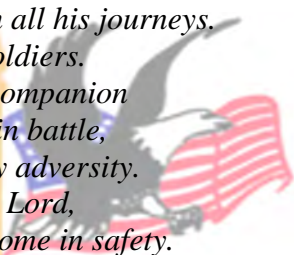

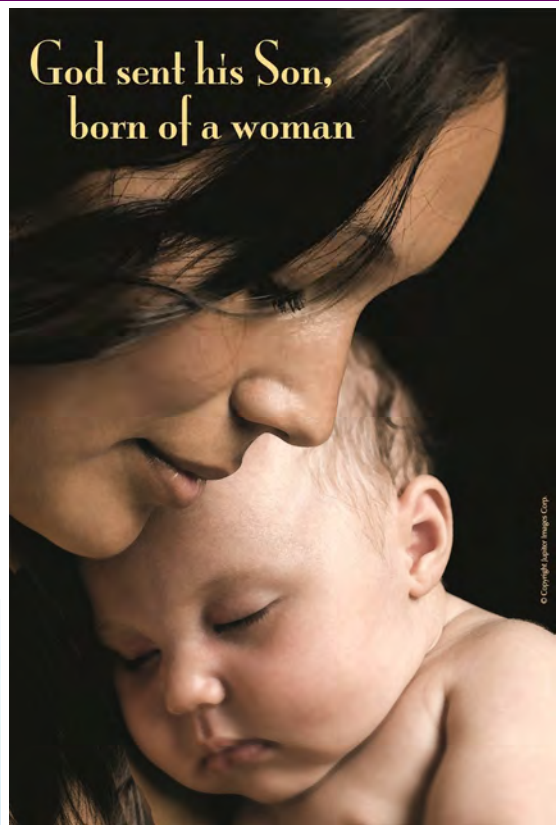
Mary, the Holy Mother of God

Today's readings include another account of the story of Jesus' birth. Numbers reminds us that we are blessed. We are looked upon with kindness and grace. The psalm and Galatians remind us of the blessings given through God's Son. Luke tells of our ultimate blessing, that Mary, a human being like us, gave birth to a child who is God's Son. Mary, a young mother, watches all that is happening around the birth of her son. She listens as the shepherds bring messages from angels, a message she also received from an angel, about her son. Yet Mary remains silent. She keeps all this news about her son to herself. She reflects on all these experiences. The only thing she shares is the name of her son, Jesus, a name given him before he was even conceived. Her silence leaves us wondering if this is how one responds to such a great blessing.

ANSWER TO OUR PRAYER

There is lots of news from various sources in these readings. Moses, Paul, angels, shepherds, all have some news about this child. But there is no news from Mary. Mary is silent and reflective. The shepherds' message is amazing, but she had heard this message before and her response then was to say yes. Yes to the uncertainty, the unknown, the blessing. Her response now is to reflect, keeping all these things in her heart. She said yes and now that yes is real in her infant son. She holds the fulfillment of that earlier promise in her arms and she is powerfully aware of how small and vulnerable that promise is. She knows that her son, God's Son, is the answer to the prayers of so many for so long, and she knows how fragile that answer is. Her son needs to be loved and nurtured. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

"Octave" comes from the Latin word for "eight," and since eight is one step beyond seven, the number of days in a week, it has long been seen as a symbol of perfection, completion, and new beginnings. Early Christians called Sunday the "eighth day," since it was the day after the Sabbath and a day of resurrected life, the Lord's Day. By the seventh century, people regarded the eight days after Easter Sunday as one great day, an octave, one glorious feast when people were forbidden to fast or kneel. In the seventh century, Pentecost acquired an Octave, too. Christmas didn't claim the honor of a continuous feast, but it did get an Octave Day. January 1 is the oldest Marian feast, the Octave of Christmas. It was originally a feast of the motherhood of Mary, although for centuries until 1969 it was called the Feast of the Circumcision. Our reformed calendar follows the earlier tradition of celebrating Mary as Mother of God.

Quo vadis...

My Dear Parishioners: Today we celebrate liturgically the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God and civilly the beginning of a New Calendar Year. “Don’t get in my face!” It is an expression we all understand. “Leave me alone.” The readings for the Solemnity we observe today move us in the opposite direction. These readings remind us that God invites us into the divine presence and offers us salvation. Mary is the model for our response to these blessings of God in our daily lives. We must keep them before our sight and ponder them deeply so that God’s blessings become for us a holy way of life, most especially through the Eucharistic Communion that we share each and every time we process forward to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus.

Since this publication is due to the printer before the Solemnity of Christmas (why, I have no clue?) my comments are somewhat limited. I am grateful to all who have sacrificed for our parish community during this past year. We are only as strong as our parishioners willingness to be witnesses to our Catholic Faith in the world. Together we proclaim Jesus, born of Mary, crucified, died, buried and risen from the dead. I approach 2017 with a sense of hope that we will continue to build upon the foundation that has been established through the years.

This coming year marks a significant milestone for our parish community: the 45th Anniversary of the Dedication of our Parish Church building and the relocation of our

parish from Heyers Mill Road to our present location at the corner of Route 34 and Phalanx Road (which is close to the geographical center of Colts Neck Township). Catholic Mass has been celebrated in our community since the 1870’s with the dedication of the original Saint Mary’s Church in 1879. A resident pastor was appointed but local folklore has it that he wasn’t compensated, so he was transferred to another pastorate. Our community was served by local clergy for more than 90 years. With the purchase of the current property and the construction of the “house of the Church” our community was designated a parish in 1972 with the Reverend Fr. Raymond Griffin appointed founding pastor. Therefore, we will celebrate the 45th Anniversary of our parish community this year. More information will be in the parish bulletins, monthly e-blasts, etc.... Let’s take the time to celebrate the gift of our faith, those who have gone before us, those here in our time, and those who will follow us.

Many thanks to all those who have generously participated in the 2016 Christmas Collection. We will render an accounting to you later in the month so there remains time for you to make your gift. Remember that the Christmas Season continues until the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Have a great week. Let us remember one another in prayer. Merry Christmas. Happy, Healthy & Holy New Year to you and your family. May 2017 be a time of renewed faith and great grace. Peace. Father Jeff.

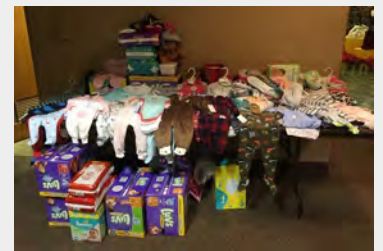
