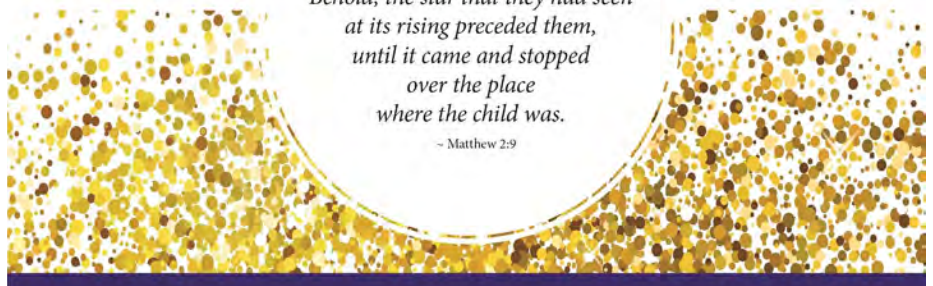

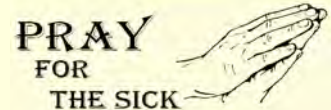

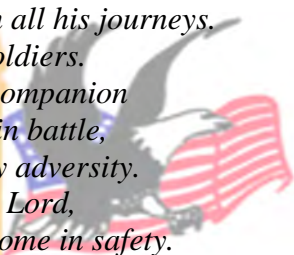

THE STAR OF BETHLEHEM

The unfolding of the story of the Incarnation continues today as the Church celebrates the Epiphany. The tale of the magi from the East is one of the most fascinating in all of scripture. It has much to teach us about what we can come to expect, even in circumstances and places that may seem insignificant or small. Bethlehem was a tiny town, what we might refer to today as a town without even one stop light. Yet it is over this seemingly insignificant place that the guiding star stops in its own search for the place where the Savior would be born. Too often we fail to recognize the fact that the star of Bethlehem comes to rest in our everyday lives, where we can experience God's presence, manifested in ever new ways. Epiphany calls us to shake off our stupor and recognize the One who comes to save us.

My Dear Parishioners:

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of our Lord. Christianity is a “show thee state” because we are to demonstrate to others our faith in action. I am so very grateful to all who helped prepare our parish for the Christmas Season: those who cleaned--especially our religious education students and confirmation prep candidates, decorated, changed light bulbs, placed figurines in the crèche, shined brass

appointments, practiced music, photocopied, folded and mailed letters, dropped off baked goods to the parish house, shared Christmas Cheer and generously supported our parish community with your Christmas Stewardship Offering. I learned of those things that worked so very well in service to our parishioners and those areas that need some improvement. All things in time as I continue to listen, observe and learn. I am grateful for all that you do and for the way in which our parish community prays together.

Let’s keep the Christmas Spirit alive in our homes and in our hearts as we continue to make our journey through this great season. This coming Monday is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord which marks the conclusion of the Christmas Season Liturgically. Lectio Divina in the New Year St. Rose of Lima

Looking for a meaningful New Year's resolution? Seeking to grow in your adult faith?
Resolutions can be hard to keep? Want some help? Try Lectio Divina.

New this year, LECTIO DIVINA will be offered at two times!

Evening sessions will be on Thursdays from 7:00 to 8:30 pm in St. Rose of Lima Convent beginning January 12.

Daytime sessions will resume on Fridays from 10:00 to 11:30 am in the St. Rose of Lima Parish Center beginning January 13.

What is Lectio Divina?

Lectio Divina is Latin for "divine reading," "spiritual reading," or "holy reading" & represents **a method of prayer** & scriptural reading intended to promote communion with God & provide special spiritual insights.

There are **eight steps** involved in this prayer form:

1. Opening Prayer
2. Reading of the Gospel (What the Word says)
3. Explanation (What the Word means)
4. Meditation (What the Word means to me)
5. Questions for reflection (What the Word asks of me)
6. Word of Life (What the Word reminds me)
7. Action (What the Word tells me to do)
8. Prayer (What the Word makes me pray)

Presented by Fr. Michael Brizio, IMC, this group will study and reflect on the Gospel of the Sunday's liturgy so that it may become a means for God to enlighten, nourish, heal, and continue his conversation with us. We will open ourselves to God's presence in Scripture, and respond with our hearts and actions. There is no experience necessary, and no need to commit to multiple weeks. Since each week's gathering will focus on the Gospel for the upcoming Sunday, participants may attend every week or simply on the weeks that their schedule permits.
