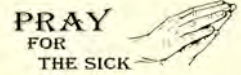



Celebrating the Lord's Day

Second of a Four part series: (Part 2)

THE SUNDAY EUCHARIST

The primary way in which we celebrate the Lord's Day is with our participation in the Sunday Eucharist. What better way to celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord than by celebration of the memorial of his Passion, Death, and Resurrection?

This celebration is not a solitary, private event. Instead, we come together as the People of God, the Church, to worship with one heart and one voice. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) teaches that "participation in the communal celebration of the Sunday Eucharist is a testimony of belonging and of being faithful to Christ and to his Church" (CCC, no. 2182).

When members of our church community are absent from this gathering, they are missed. No member of the faithful should be absent from the Sunday Eucharist without a serious reason. The Liturgy should be the first thing on Sunday's schedule, not the last. We should arrive on time, prepared in mind and heart to fully participate in the Mass. Those who cannot attend because of illness or the need to care for infants or the sick deserve our prayers and special attention.

Often, people will suggest that going to Sunday Mass is not necessary. After all, they can pray at home just as well. This has clearly been an issue in the Church for more than a millennium. In the fourth century, St. John Chrysostom addressed this problem directly: You cannot pray at home as at church, where there is a great multitude, where exclamations are cried out to God as from one great heart, and where there is something more: the union of minds, the accord of souls, the bond of charity, the prayers of the priests. (CCC, no. 2179, quoting St. John Chrysostom, *De incomprehensibili* 3, 6: PG 48, 725)

Private prayer, though essential to the spiritual life, can never replace the celebration of the eucharistic Liturgy and the reception of Holy Communion. In some communities, the lack of priests makes it impossible to celebrate the Eucharist each Sunday. In such instances, the bishop may make provision for these parish communities to gather and celebrate the Liturgy of the Word or the Liturgy of the Hours. These Sunday celebrations in the absence of a priest may or may not include the reception of Holy Communion. Still, these celebrations allow the People of God to gather and keep holy the Lord's Day.

CHOIR CAMP at SAINT MARY'S PARISH!!!

To follow Summer Intensive Religious Education Sessions

These much sought-after choir programs are now at St. Mary's! In addition to the summer religious education program, music directors Lauren Walters and Andrew Macirowski are offering a 6 session Choir Camp Intensive for all students in the RE Summer Intensive programs.

Classes will be offered from 12:30 – 1:30pm on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, & Thursdays of each 2 week session. (Session I July 6-17 & Session II August 3- 14)

In these 60 minute classes students will learn:

- The basics of good vocal techniques – sing anytime, anywhere!
- The foundations of solfeggio and sight reading both chant and modern notation
- Rhythmic patterning
- Musical styling over 8 centuries
- Musical settings of the Mass
- Common church hymns, songs, psalms & chants
- How Catholicism has shaped even the modern music of today
- Instrumentation at Mass – organ, piano, bells, etc. – yes, students will have the opportunity to play each of the instruments!
- What is the role of the sung leadership in a Mass: cantor, schola cantorum, choir, etc.

Students will be asked to rehearse music on their own, provided with learning tools, so that they might lead Mass the following Sunday after the Choir Camp that follows each of the Summer Intensive Sessions...plus an exciting opportunity that's TOP SECRET! Quo vadis...

My Dear Parishioners:

Today we celebrate the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The gospel is filled with symbolism. The storm is a metaphor for the difficulties that beset us at every stage of life. The boat is an image of the church gathered-- a suffering, persecuted, challenged Church. The gospel illustrates the care that we desire: that the storm be stilled, that we be delivered. The first reading illustrates what God offers us: that God is present at all times. How do we read this story, we who already know who Jesus is? The gospel challenges us to move beyond an understanding of Jesus as the one who is there when we need Him (even though that is true) to the beckoning Light who brings us home to eternal life.

As summer begins we celebrate God's gift of recreation so that we might be re-created and readied for continued spiritual, physical and social progress in our lives and in our community. During the coming weeks some of our parish music ministry personnel will be on holiday and there may be times when we sing a cappella. We will strive to cover our religious services with appropriate music. However, each of us can contribute to the faithful celebration of the liturgy by participating well in our prayer together. It is good for all of us to work hard, but it is equally good that we make time to be re-created. It is necessary for us to remember that we are essentially spiritual beings and not machines; therefore time for slowing down, smelling the roses and renewing relationships can be vital to our own progress as disciples of the Lord Jesus.

During these last weeks of the fiscal year our staff is busy finishing up the details of administration and preparing for a new fiscal year. Preparations are proceeding nicely for the

publication of our Annual Stewardship Report due out in late September of this year. This is one of the ways in which the oversight of our parish is transparent to you the parishioner stakeholders in the mission and ministry of our parish community. I thank all of you for your serious commitment to our parish so that we can fulfill our obligations and honor the commitments that have been made to compensate to our co-workers, properly maintain our facilities and offering the very best opportunities for worship, outreach, ministry and spiritual growth.

This weekend we welcome our Pastor Emeritus as he celebrates mass with us. Later in the month of July Fr. Bausch will return to our parish as he celebrates 60 Years of Priestly Ordination. He will preside at mass, offer the homily and then we will have a "simple" reception at his request. 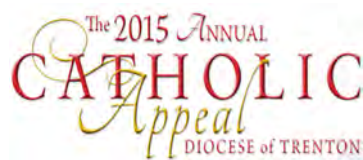
