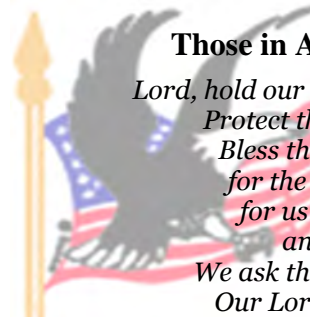

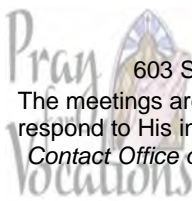

Highlights from the Pope's message for World Mission Sunday 2015

2015 World Mission Sunday Appeal
The Society for the Propagation of the Faith

The 2015 World Mission Sunday takes place in the context of the Year of Consecrated Life, which provides a further stimulus for prayer and reflection. There is a **clear connection between consecrated life and mission.**

The desire to follow Jesus closely, which led to the emergence of consecrated life in the Church, responds to his call to take up the cross and follow him, to imitate his dedication to the Father and his service and love, to lose our life so as to gain it. **Since Christ's entire existence had a missionary character, so too, all those who follow him closely must possess this missionary quality.**

The **missionary dimension, which belongs to the very nature of the Church**, is also intrinsic to all forms of consecrated life, and cannot be neglected without detracting from and disfiguring its charism.

Being a missionary is not about proselytizing or mere strategy; mission is part of the "grammar" of faith, something essential for those who listen to the voice of the Spirit who whispers "Come" and "Go forth."

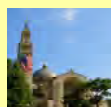
Those who follow Christ cannot fail to be missionaries, for they know that Jesus "walks with them, speaks to them, breathes with them. They sense Jesus alive with them in the midst of the missionary enterprise. (Evangelii Gaudium, 266).

In Jesus' command to 'go forth,' we see the scenarios and ever-present new challenges of the **Church's evangelizing mission. All her members are called to proclaim the Gospel by their witness of life;** the witness of life; in a particular way, consecrated men and women are asked to listen to the voice of the Spirit who calls them to **go to the peripheries, to those to whom the Gospel has not yet been proclaimed.**



Dear brothers and sisters, a **true missionary is passionate for the Gospel.** On this point there can be no compromise: those who by God's grace accept the mission, are called to live the mission. **Mission is a passion for Jesus and at the same time a passion for his people.**

Quo vadis...

A Few Words to The Parish of Saint Mary...

Time goes by. Certainly does. I came to St. Mary's more than 20 years ago to help out for a week or so. Father Bausch needed a priest at the time to help out for a couple of weekends until he got someone. I was living at the Passionist house in South River then, only 20 minutes from Colts Neck, and I agreed to come. Twenty years later, I'm still here on weekends, though now I'm living about 2 hours away at Immaculate Conception Monastery, in Queens, New York. The weeks and years have gone by.

Since I first came to St. Mary's, your parish has had three pastors besides Father Bausch – Father Ed Griswold, Father Tom Triggs and Father Jeff Lee, all of them good priests whom I have been blessed to know. You've been blessed with good pastors and I can say the same for the deacons and staff here as well.

A term from the Letter of St. Peter might best sum up my appreciation of St. Mary's. "Living stones," Peter called the people of the church. I like that way of describing the church. It doesn't mean buildings and grounds aren't important. They are. (Let me say I like our new shrine of Mary very much.) But people make our church, by living their faith and being firmly loyal to Jesus Christ. Living stones bring the church to wherever they are, to their homes, to work, to a world beyond church buildings.

St. Mary's is a church of "living stones." I often think of that, welcoming you to Mass, preaching or celebrating the sacraments. You come to be refreshed by God's grace, and I think St. Mary's is a place of refreshing grace. We have been blessed with remarkable people over the years, some have moved on, some now belong to the communion of saints above, some carry on St. Mary's rich tradition. "Living stones."

That tradition may explain why people from over 70 zip codes want to belong to St. Mary's, according to Father Jeff in the report on the parish he gave a few weeks ago. He also said that the parish is changing, becoming younger, with more baptisms than funerals. Those statistics are a challenge to prepare for a new generation of believers. I'm sure St. Mary's will meet that challenge, if the past is any predictor of the future. We can't avoid change.

I can't avoid change either. Just so you know, I've asked Father Jeff if I could cut down on weekends I'll be here for Masses, especially as the winter months approach. By car or by train, it's a hike for me to get here on weekends from Jamaica, New York, and as I said at the beginning – time goes by. I ain't as young as I used to be. So you'll see me less at St. Mary's.

I'm not retiring, only adjusting. I like doing what I'm doing. I like coming to St. Mary's. The monastery where I live has a daily schedule of prayer and ministry, and I still get excited working in the "social media," blogging and developing a web site I've started.

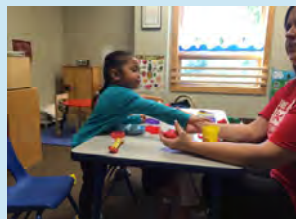
