What is Eucharistic Adoration?

Understood simply, Eucharistic Adoration is adoring or honoring the Eucharistic Presence of Christ. In a deeper sense, it involves "the contemplation of the Mystery of Christ truly present before us". During Eucharistic Adoration, we "watch and wait", we remain "silent" in His Presence and open ourselves to His Graces which flow from the Eucharist ... By worshipping the Eucharistic Jesus, we become what God wants us to be! Like a magnet, The Lord draws us to Himself and gently transforms us. In its fullest essence ... Eucharistic Adoration is "God and Man reaching out for each other, at the same time!" The Monstrance contains the Sacred Host. At all other times, the reserved Sacrament is kept locked in the Tabernacle, so that the faithful may pray in the presence of the Sacrament.



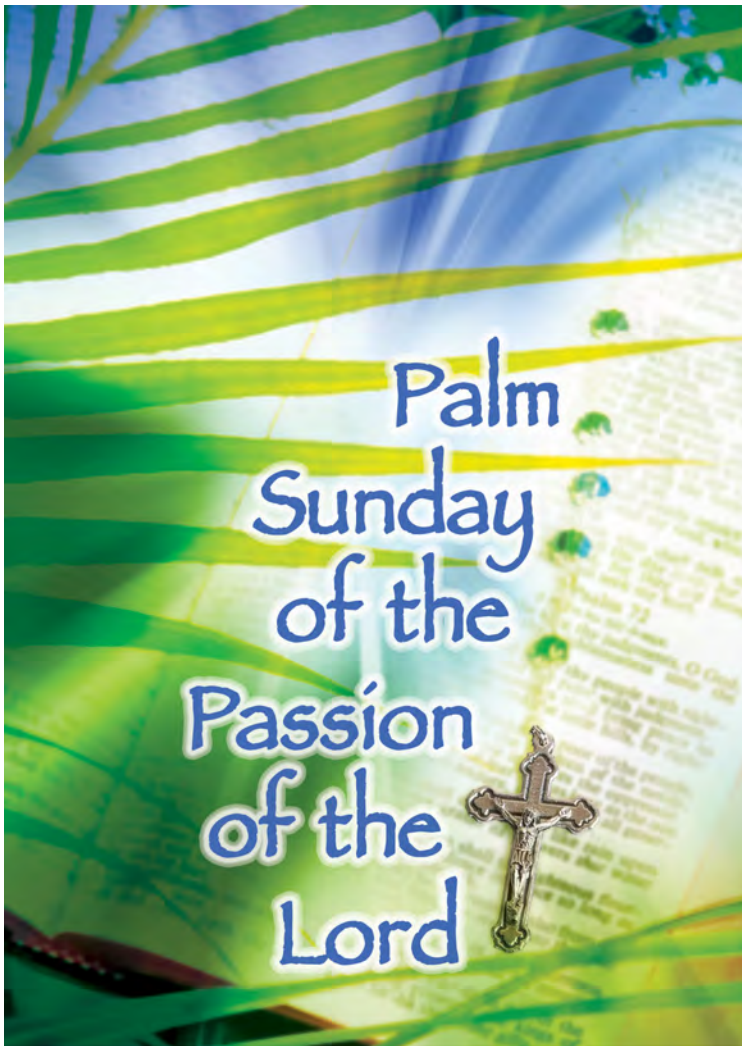
The Eucharist is: Jesus truly present - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity!

PROPHETIC ANOINTING

The solemnity of today’s readings invites us into silent contemplation of the mystery of our redemption. There are so many levels on which to understand the events of the Passion. The woman who anoints Jesus acts prophetically in a way that the other disciples do not yet grasp. Anointing is for priests, prophets, and kings, and also for the preparation of the dead. It is for healing and for holiness. Her action acknowledges the imminent events of the passion and death of the Lord, and points toward his resurrection and triumph over evil and death. He is priest and victim, prophet and God, King and Lord. All these things are acknowledged in her prophetic anointing.



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Is today “Palm Sunday” or “Passion Sunday”? Though now known officially as Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, confusion is understandable, since before the 1969 reform of the calendar two separate Sundays bore these titles. Passion Sunday was a week before Palm Sunday. To add to the confusion, the Gospel accounts of the Passion of the Lord were not read on Passion Sunday, but on Palm Sunday! On Passion Sunday, the cross and statues were veiled in full purple drapes. The organ had fallen silent at the beginning of Lent, and now the sanctuary bells were replaced by wooden clappers. The introit (opening chant) for the old Mass of Passion Sunday hints at a reason for reform: “Do me justice, O God, and fight my fight against a faithless people” (Psalm 42). This liturgy was laden with references to the “infidelity” of the Jews, a theme that gave rise to inflammatory preaching and, in some places, attacks against the persons and property of the Jewish people. This does not stand as a “treasure” of any sort in our tradition. Our authentic tradition, rather, is the ability to reflect and repent and to seek reconciliation with the Jews, our brothers and sisters in the love and service of God.

My Dear Parishioners: Today we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion and Death. The essence of discipleship is that we don't simply receive the fruit of Jesus' suffering and death; the essence of discipleship is that we carry his cross. Disciples go wherever the Master goes. Coming to understand who Jesus is, his mission, and how that relates to us his disciples is no easy task; it takes a lifetime. Like Jesus, to be faithful followers by taking up our cross means, we will feel this to the depths of our humanity: we will suffer, we will lose heart, we will cry out to God to take life's miserable lot away from us. But also like Jesus we have divine life which gives us the strength to carry our cross. It is divine life pulsing within us - which we first receive at our baptism - that raises up our humanity enabling us to be faithful disciples carrying our crosses.

Congratulations to all those who celebrated their First Penance & Reconciliation last weekend. We are very grateful to the catechists and faith formation staff for their tireless dedication. I am pleased to announce the appointments of Mrs. Jennifer Schlameuss Perry and Mr. Matt Butler who will join Mrs. Michele McCue in providing for the needs of our parish Faith Formation and Life Long Learning. Both Jen and Matt have parish staff experience and both hold an MA in Theology. More information to come in the weeks ahead. I am grateful to those who served on the interview teams for their recommendation to me. Preparations are underway for the Parish Master Calendar for 2015-2016. I remind all that our Summer Session Religious Education opportunities are nearly fully subscribed for this coming summer. Lauren Walters is developing a Summer Music Camp for those children interested. More details are contained in the coming bulletins. Registration & Re-Registration will soon commence for the 2015-2016 year. Please anticipate your needs and complete the process in a timely manner so that we might provide for the needs of all our children and families. Our Easter Egg Hunt this year is scheduled for Sunday, 12 April 2015, the Octave day of Easter. Our thoughts are that there are so many activities leading up to Easter Sunday, why not try during the Octave. This is a great

opportunity for Children and Families to enjoy this event and reflect on the gift of new life we are promised in the Resurrection of Christ.

This week the Chrism Mass will be celebrated by His Excellency, The Most Reverend Bishop of Trenton on Monday at 7:30pm at Saint Robert Parish, Freehold. One of the great traditions in our parish community is our care for the celebration of the liturgy. The celebration of the Triduum (3 Days: Holy Thursday-Good Friday-Easter Vigil) is an opportunity for us to reflect on the mysteries of our faith and to celebrate them with dignity and reverence. This year we will continue the Eucharistic Procession from the Main Church to Madonna Hall on Holy Thursday Evening. With candles and flowers and music, we will transfer the Eucharistic presence of Our Lord to the "Chapel of Repose" during the Triduum. Public Adoration is available on Thursday Evening until 11:00pm and on Friday morning prayer with private adoration until the Service of the Lord's Passion at 12:00 noon in the Church followed by Outdoor Way of the Cross at 3:00pm. We will pray morning prayer in our chapel of repose in Madonna Hall on Friday and Saturday. Remember to bring with you your special baked goods, meats and Easter Baskets on Saturday at 9am and we will bless them during morning prayer. There will be no 5:00pm Mass on Holy Saturday as prescribed by Liturgical Law. The Easter Vigil will be celebrated at 7:30pm. We have an additional Mass Easter Sunday for your convenience. Please check the adjusted times. I am please to inform you that our Pastor Emeritus Father Bausch will celebrate the 12:00 noon Mass here in our parish. Plan on participating in these beautiful and prayerful liturgies. These are busy days. Much collaboration is required in order to celebrate the Sacred Liturgy in a prayerful and dignified manner. In advance, I thank all those who so generously share their time and talent to make our parish community the welcoming, prayerful and reverent community it continues to become. Have a great week.
