

Liturgy Of The Hours:



The fourth of the five Hours of the Divine Office is:



Evening Prayer

"When evening approaches and the day is already far spent, evening prayer is celebrated in order that 'we may give thanks for what has been given us, or what we have done well, during the day.' We also recall the redemption through the prayer we send up 'like incense in the Lord's sight,' and in which 'the raising up of our hands' becomes 'an evening sacrifice' (see Ps 141:2). This sacrifice 'may also be interpreted more spiritually as the true evening sacrifice that our Savior the Lord entrusted to the apostles at supper on the evening when he instituted the sacred mysteries of the Church or of the evening sacrifice of the next day, the sacrifice, that is, which, raising his hands, he offered to the Father at the end of the ages for the salvation of the whole world.' Again, in order to fix our hope on the light that knows no setting, 'we pray and make petition for the light to come down on us anew; we implore the coming of Christ who will bring the grace of eternal light.' Finally, at this hour we join with the Churches of the East in calling upon the 'joy-giving light of that holy glory, born of the immortal, heavenly Father, the holy and blessed Jesus Christ; now that we have come to the setting of the sun and have seen the evening star, we sing in praise of God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit...' (GILH, no. 39).-United States Conference of Catholic Bishops

Quo vadis...

My Dear Parishioners:

Today we celebrate The Solemnity of The Most Holy Trinity. Liturgy does for us what the Deuteronomy texts did for Israel of old: helps us remember God's mighty deeds and enter into a covenantal relationship with the Divine. Liturgy calls us to gather to as, "Who is this God?" Knowing God isn't something we can find out in the abstract; knowing God is dependent concretely on our doing—in taking up Christ's mission and living our own privileged identity as daughters and sons of God "until the end of the age." Without doing as Jesus did, we cannot answer "Who is God?" This doing is nothing less than to "suffer with" Christ (second reading), which means a constant dying to self. By our own self-emptying, we are filled with the divine identity.

The Solemnity of Pentecost was a wonderful experience this year. Thanks to all those who wore some article of clothing that was red. This helped us to decorate the Church building. Next Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. The Eucharist is the center of our life as Roman Catholic Christians. It is the Eucharist that makes the Church and it is the Church that makes the Eucharist. Everything we do and who we are flows from the Eucharist. That is why the Church instructs us to come to Mass each and every Sunday and to receive the Holy Eucharist as frequently as we can. We also honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus in a special way this month. May we learn mercy and compassion through our prayerful devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

There is a lot happening around our parish these days. Master Calendar preparation is nearly completed for 2015-16; Capital Budget items are being identified; FYE 2016 Budget is close to being finalized; Staff Salary proposals are being reviewed; Preparations for Summer Religious Education Classes & Summer Choir Camp; Worship Aid Production to insure the vibrant liturgical life we continue to nurture in our parish; Needed mechanical and site work will commence at the Grotto and Peace Garden thanks to a generous charitable bequest which will fund this work in its entirety; New Construction of a Parish House: Residence, Garages & Storage is scheduled to commence this July; the opening of our Childcare Center & Pre-School is moving along nicely with Come & See opportunities being scheduled for June 2015; and the lists go on and on and on. Thank you for all that you are doing to enable our parish to serve the needs in our community. Many thanks to all those who have made a pledge to the 2015 Annual Catholic Appeal, we are so very close to reaching our parish goal. Thanks to all those who have completed their pledge payments. Please continue to fulfill your pledge payments so that our parish can reach its goal. We are inching ever closer to our local parish goal. Thank you for the sacrifices that you make so that the vibrancy of this community continues to support the efforts of the larger diocesan church and our Most Reverend Bishop. Have a great week.
