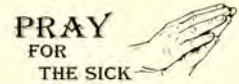

## MUSICAL NOTATIONS – Easter Season to Ordinary Time

*Hello, my friends! It's that time of year again, where we change up the Mass settings and have all kinds of musical activity...just to keep you on your toes!*

Pentecost marks the end of the Easter Season, and on Pentecost we enjoyed the musical presentations of every choir (all 4!) at the 10:00 Mass. A little about that: a Sprinkling Rite is always optional and replaces the Kyrie (Lord Have Mercy) when done in the Ordinary Form of the Mass. It is encouraged even more so throughout the Easter season, so it was fitting to sing "Springs of Water" at all the Masses. At the 10:00, the Schola Cantorum chanted the "Vidi Aquam", which is the appropriate chant for the Easter season during the Sprinkling Rite. Additionally, we sang a "Sequence" before the Gospel Acclamation. There are 3 times when a Sequence is sung: on Easter, Pentecost, and Corpus Christi. These are the actual "liturgical hymns of the Mass", specifically composed to be sung before the Gospel Acclamation. The 10:00 Mass combined forces to have drums, guitar, and soloists from every choir to sing the day's Sequence "Veni Sancte Spiritus" (Come Holy Spirit). It is always appropriate to sing the Veni Creator Spiritus (Come Creator Spirit), but even more so on the birthday of the Church!

Then, we transition back to Ordinary Time, which means a change in the liturgical Mass setting. We use the concise, through-composed chants of the Roman Missal...which is the official "Mass setting" of the Catholic Church throughout the world. Don't let the title of "Ordinary Time" fool you...it actually comes in with a 1-2 punch of Solemnities. The first is the Feast of the Holy Trinity and the second, Corpus Christi (Body & Blood of Christ). Corpus Christi concludes the end of the "choral year" before summer and because such great music was composed for this feast, we hosted a lovely string trio to really bolster the beauty of *Jesus My Lord, My God, My All* sung during the presentation and Mozart's Ave Verum Corpus following Communion, among other pieces of music that speak to the soul.

That said, wishing you a beautiful feast day! *Until next time... pax! Lauren Walters*

My Dear Parishioners:

Today we celebrate The Solemnity Of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ also known as Corpus Christi Sunday. In fact, few of us will be challenged literally to put the proverbial collar around the cat. But all of us, through baptism, truly are challenged to have the same self-giving stance as Jesus. When we truly believe that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist, then our actions and attitudes reflect that true presence. The communion procession is a time for us to be intensely focused on the fact that God is coming to us in this sacrament. Our reverence and respect for the awesomeness of this sacrament will help to inspire and teach our young people. May Christ continue to be made present in our midst through the Eucharist that we faithfully celebrate together.

Ordinations and various Graduations are times for family members to gather in celebration and in support of one another. Let us continue to also support those who are experiencing the mega milestones in their life this year. ### What Is A Hashtag?

A hashtag is a word, or group of words that an individual would type following a pound sign (#) as a tag, or marker for the topic. It makes your tweet more visible for folks searching for a particular topic. Organizations, individuals, businesses or events will often invite followers to use the hashtag when posting about it in an effort to bring attention or hype to it. They will come up with a specific hashtag for followers to use, to bring traffic to that item. For example, some hashtags used in association with Pope Francis are: #pontifex and #popefrancis. When people post about him using these hashtags, they become links, and people can click them to see other posts about him. Any word or phrase can become a searchable hashtag, but it's important to make sure that it doesn't have too many words so it can be easily understood.
