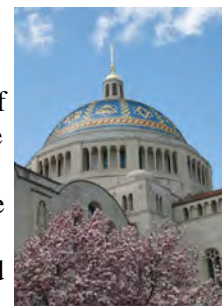

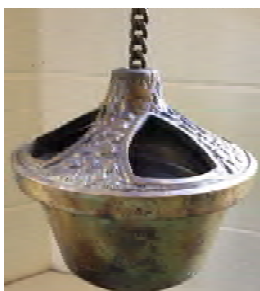
Incense, why, when, and what type?

The use of incense in the ancient world was common, especially in religious rites. In Judaism, incense was included in the thanksgiving offerings of oil, rain, fruits, and wine. We do not know exactly when the use of incense was introduced into our Mass or other liturgical rites. At the time of the early Church, the Jews continued to use incense in their own Temple rituals, so it would be safe to conclude that the Christians would have adapted its usage for their own rituals. Keep in mind that one of the 3 Gifts brought to Jesus at birth by the Magi was Frankincense, recognizing Jesus' priestly role as well as His deity.



In the liturgies of Ss. James and Mark, which in their present form originate in the fifth century, the use of incense is mentioned. A Roman Ritual of the 7th century marks its usage in the procession of a Bishop to the altar and on Good Friday. Moreover, in the Mass, an incensation at the Gospel appears very early; at the offertory, in the 11th century; and at the Introit, in the 12th century. Incense was also used at the Benedictus and Magnificat during Lauds and Vespers about the 13th century, and for the exposition and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament about the 14th century. Gradually, its usage was extended to the incensing of the celebrant and assisting clergy.

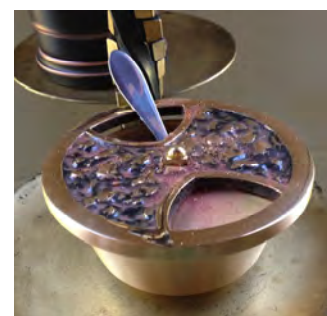
The purpose of incensing and the symbolic value of the smoke is that of purification and sanctification. For example, in the Eastern Rites at the beginning of Mass, the altar and sanctuary area were incensed. The smoke symbolizes the prayers of the faithful drifting up to heaven.



In the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, which guides us in proper liturgy, incense may be used during the entrance procession; at the beginning of Mass, to incense the altar; at the procession and proclamation of the Gospel; at the offertory, to incense the offerings, altar, priest and people; and at the elevation of the Sacred Host and chalice of Precious Blood after the consecration. The priest may also incense the Crucifix and the Paschal Candle. During funeral Masses, the priest at the final commendation may incense the coffin, both as a sign of honor to the body of the deceased which became the temple of the Holy Spirit at Baptism and as a sign of the faithful's prayers for the deceased rising to God.

The use of incense adds a sense of solemnity and mystery to the Mass. The visual imagery of the smoke and the smell remind us of the transcendence of the Mass which links heaven with earth, and allow us to enter into the presence of God.

The word "incense" comes from the Latin *incendere*, a verb meaning "to burn". . . Here at St Mary's we use 4 different aromatic blends depending upon the Liturgical Season. For example during Ordinary Time the blend we use is called "Basilica". The types we use are made from various tree resins, gums, and botanical materials and are carefully poured onto a burning coal briquette at the appropriate time. Blends selected must be of good and noble in quality and fragrance and because of allergies by both congregation and clergy alike, they must be as hypoallergenic as possible. Because of the nature and reverence due at certain liturgies, we use incense During Holy Week, on all Solemnities, certain Feast Days, during certain Liturgical Seasons such as Advent, Lent, Christmas and Easter, and at all funerals. - Taken in part from "Why is incense used at Mass", Fr. Quo vadis...

My Dear Parishioners: Today we celebrate the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The development of the Bread of Life discourse leads us to a broader understanding of Eucharist. Jesus' invitation in giving us his flesh and blood to eat and drink is an invitation to enter into his own self-giving. Eucharist is self-giving. We can be self-giving like Jesus because by eating his flesh and drinking his blood we become Jesus, the body of Christ. This is why we can "remain" in Jesus — we are transformed by what we eat. Our relationship to Jesus, then, becomes a relationship of indwelling, of divine life. This is why Eucharist is a promise of eternal life: because we already have divine life within us. Eucharist is both gift given and an invitation to our self-giving. The mystery of Eucharist strengthens us for our daily dying and rising, our daily giving of ourselves for the sake of others so that we all might share more abundantly in divine life. How can we afford not to say Amen?

Many, many thanks to all those who assisted with our celebration of the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, welcoming His Excellency, The Most Reverend Bishop of Trenton, and the Blessing of our renovated Grotto and Prayer Garden. The flag pole, given by the Boy Scouts in honor of our founding pastor Father Raymond Griffin has been relocated to the prayer garden and repaired in honor of all veterans who have served in defense of our country and freedom. What is the Spiritual Adoption Program?

The purpose of the Spiritual Adoption Program is threefold:

1. To encourage parishes, schools, and other communities to pray for babies in danger of abortion.
1. To educate adults and children about the development of the pre-born child.
3. To provide mothers in need with assistance at a "baby shower" of donated baby gifts & contributions at the conclusion of the program.



This is done by encouraging people to "Spiritually Adopt" an unborn baby and to follow their baby along the path to being born.

How does Spiritual Adoption work?

The Parish of Saint Mary will be participating in the Spiritual Adoption Program through a special ministry called "God's Little Lamb." Prayer squares are knit and decorated with the pledge prayer for the unborn and a miraculous medal. Next, the squares are inserted into plastic bags along with a pamphlet on "Life before Birth." Squares will be available for distribution to all interested parishioners after all Masses on September 13-14, 2015.



Walking with Purpose is a Catholic women's Bible study that aims to bring women to a deeper personal relationship with Jesus Christ by offering personal study and small group discussion that link our everyday challenges and struggles with the solutions given to us through the teachings of Christ and the Roman Catholic Church.

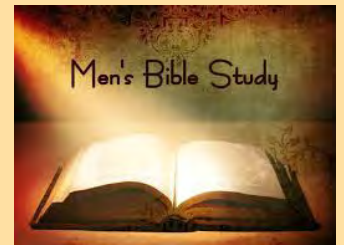

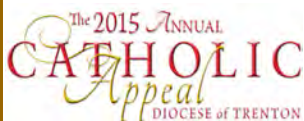
