



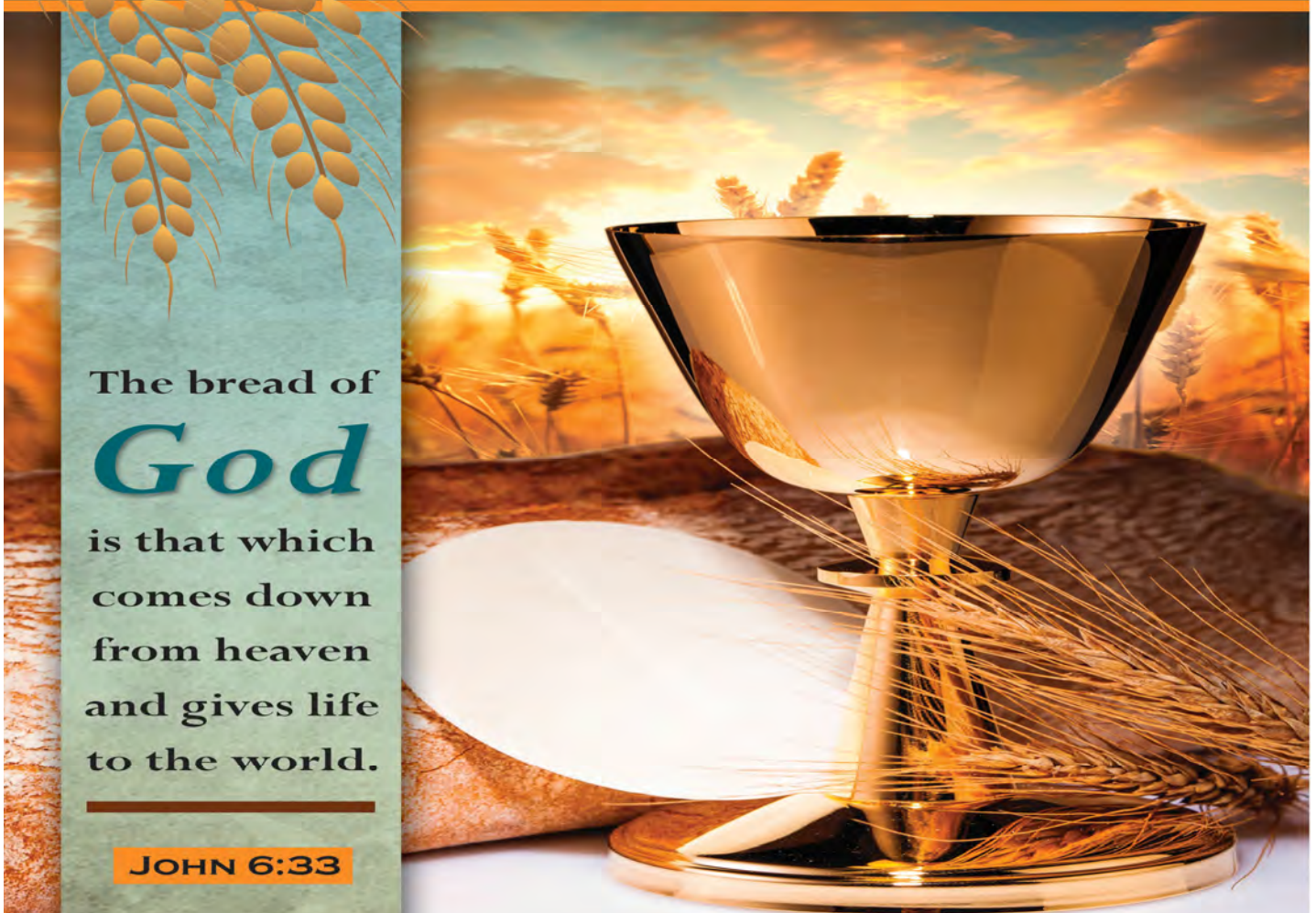

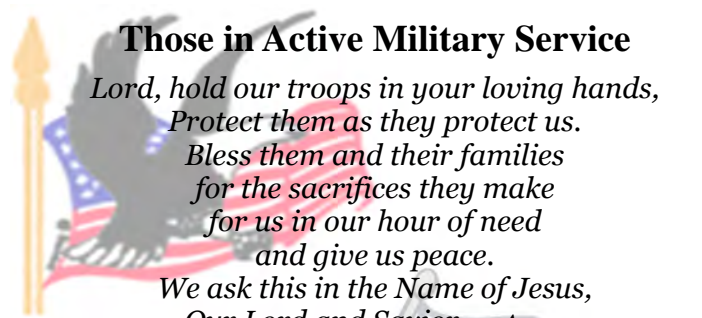

Quo vadis...

My Dear Parishioners:

Today the Universal Church celebrates the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. What we need before receiving Eucharist is a personal relationship with Jesus. There is a curious paradox here: on the one hand, we need to feast on Jesus who is the Bread of Life in order to strengthen our belief, our relationship with him. On the other hand, we must have a relationship with Jesus (belief) in order for Eucharist to nourish us. Belief and bread from heaven come together in Jesus, who gives himself to us. If Jesus is the bread from heaven given for us and we are the Body of Christ, then we must conclude that we ourselves are to be bread from heaven that fosters eternal life for others. As God has "set his seal" on Jesus, so through baptism and confirmation, has God "set his seal" on us. Jesus gives himself as bread from heaven; we give ourselves to others as bread from heaven when we confirm our belief by means of the everyday actions we do. Treating another as the Body of Christ is believing. Taking time to be in touch with our spiritual needs is believing. Reaching out in compassion to others is believing. Self-giving is believing.

It is hard to believe that the month of August is upon us. The summer is nearly half complete. There has been a lot of coming and going within our community. Parishioners and staff are taking time for some holiday, rest and re-creation. This is good. A time to re-connect with family and friends is good too. Don't forget to make it a priority to participate in the Sunday Mass wherever you find yourself. The Lord awaits us especially on Sunday. Make the celebration of the Eucharist a deliberate part of your summer time away. Next weekend, we will welcome a visiting missionary priest as part of our parish participation in the Society for the Propagation of the Faith Mission Cooperative Program. This is one of the great aspects of our Roman Catholic Church...our responsibility to assist those who bring the message of the Gospel to all corners of the earth. We are all so blessed. Part of stewardship is sharing our blessings. Come with an open mind

and heart so that our parish might continue to support the poor and needy.

Work continues to progress on the Grotto and Prayer Garden Renovation. Our parish will welcome His Excellency, The Most Reverend Bishop of Trenton for the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, patroness of our Diocese of Trenton. Bishop O'Connell will celebrate Mass Friday, 14 August, 2015, at 7:00pm in our parish church. We will process to the Grotto and Prayer Garden so that His Excellency might bless this newly renovated place of prayer and solitude. Please come and be a part of this milestone in the history of our parish.

Take note of the 2 planted islands in the south parking area of our campus. The work was coordinated by Nick Peckyno as part of his application to be considered for Eagle Scout. The design was prepared by Nicholas Ginther of DW Smith landscape architects and the Eagle Scout raises the funds for or the materials needed as a demonstration of leadership. We have another young man, Tom Zita, who has been in dialogue with us to plant two additional areas. We are most grateful to these young men for their commitment and stewardship in our midst as we strive to complete the plan for our parking lot as it was designed years ago. Our Wednesday Garden Club has begun the tedious work of restoring the perennial garden located directly behind and in full view of the Chapel. More helpers are always welcome. Recall that last year was a thorough cleaning of all the stack chairs throughout the entire campus. This year we will wash all of the non-painted wood doors. This is equally as arduous a task. SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PROGRAM

Everyone loves the beauty and innocence of a baby. As an expression of that love, Saint Mary Parish members will soon have the opportunity to “**spiritually adopt**” a child who is newly conceived. On the weekend of September 12 & 13, 2015, packets containing knitted or crocheted blanket squares with a prayer card attached will be blessed at the 5:00PM Mass. They will then be available after each Mass to parishioners to begin praying over for nine months to spare the life of a newborn baby. At the end of the nine months, in June, 2016, the squares will be collected and knitted together for the baby blankets. A baby shower will be held at that time. Donated baby gifts and contributions will be collected at that celebration to be donated, along with the baby blankets, to a pregnancy center which helps mothers and their babies.

The Grotto

To the right side of the cave, a statue of Our Lady of Lourdes stands high on the lava stone wall, and within the stone cave visitors can light a votive candle. A statue of Bernadette kneels gazing up in prayerful devotion at our Lady.



In 1858 Mary appeared 18 times at Lourdes, in the Pyrenees Mountains in southern France, to Bernadette Soubirous, a fourteen-year-old peasant girl. A spring of fresh water, which appeared at the site, feeds the baths at the shrine to the present day. Many miraculous healings have been reported after people have bathed in the waters. The fact that there is no spread of infection, even though no sanitary precautions are taken when people with all sorts of diseases take baths there, is a marvel in itself. There is a medical bureau at Lourdes at which any qualified doctor can come to check alleged cures.
