Expanding on the theme of his most recent encyclical, "Laudato Si', on Care for Our Common Home," Pope Francis announced the new, worldwide commemoration to be celebrated annually on Sept. 1.



In announcing the Diocese's observance, Bishop O'Connell said, "Thanks to the gracious hospitality of Father William Lago, pastor of St. Denis Parish, we are able to commemorate this inaugural event in their beautiful chapel. It will be an appropriate setting for this Mass — sunset at the Jersey shore — and a dramatic reminder of the beautiful gift of creation that we are called to protect."



All are encouraged to join in the worldwide day of prayer, either by attending the diocesan Mass or in their personal prayers. Priests of the Diocese are invited to concelebrate.



**Pope sets up

VATICAN CITY (Reuters) - Pope Francis, riding a wave of mostly positive reaction to his encyclical on ecology, on Monday set up a Catholic "World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation" to draw attention to the plight of the planet.

The day, to be marked by the world's 1.2 billion Roman Catholics each year on Sept. 1, is Francis's latest move to try to highlight global environmental concerns ahead of a pivotal U.N. summit on climate change in Paris in December.

"As Christians we wish to contribute to resolving the ecological crisis which humanity is presently experiencing," Francis said in a letter to two Vatican cardinals whose departments are involved in issues of justice, peace and Christian unity.

Sept. 1 is also when Orthodox Christians mark their day for the protection of the environment, giving the gesture added symbolism in relations between the Eastern and Western branches of Christianity.

# Quo vadis...

---

My Dear Parishioners: Today we celebrate the Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. It's easier to clean the pots and pans than to clean one's heart! It's also easy to dismiss this gospel because our tradition has never emphasized this kind of ritual impurity. Yet, the gospel hits home closer than we may think. What traditions do we blindly cling to? Perhaps it is enough for us just to go to Mass on Sunday; after all, this is what most of us grew up doing. Or perhaps, we cling to rote prayers that we learned as a child rather than stretch our relationship with God to find new prayer expressions. Perhaps, we relegate God in our lives to an hour on Sunday. We need to look at the way we live and this will tell us whether we have hearts truly turned toward God—all the time. Purity of heart is expressed in righteous living—self-giving for the sake of others. This is how we have life.

His Holiness, Pope Francis, has declared 1 September as a day for us to remember the gifts of creation, especially the earth and all that the earth offers to sustain our everyday living. Building upon the landmark encyclical *Laudato si*, the Holy Father invites us to pray in a special way for a greater awareness of all creation, human life and the environment in which we live. This call is not one of political or social correctness, but rather one of a moral imperative recognizing that God has set humankind over creation. Therefore, we have a moral obligation to respect all that has been created and work for greater respect of all creation. May our deliberate respect for God's many gifts found in the created order inspire others to work for just environmental policies. Next weekend, we observe the Civic Holiday

recognizing the dignity of Human Labor. Let us remember all those who labor for the common good. Let us also pray for a continued increase in the working conditions for all laborers. The parish office will be closed on Monday and Mass will be celebrated at 9:00am. Our young people are preparing to begin a new school year. Let us continue to support them and their teachers with our prayer and spirit of volunteerism as needed. Likewise, our parish is preparing for another year of religious education for our young people. The religious formation of every child is the primary responsibility of parents with godparents. Parish staff and catechists are in place to support these families in their search for God in the everyday circumstances of life. This might be a good time for me to reiterate the importance of parents accompanying their children to Mass each Sunday and for Holy Days; dressing appropriately, arriving on time, remaining until the final blessing are all ways that we witness to the importance of Sunday Eucharist in the life of every Catholic.

For those who have not participated in the 2015 Annual Catholic Appeal, please do so as soon as possible. For those who have already participated, THANK YOU! A parish is the responsibility of all involved and not simply a few people. Together let us discern how God is calling us to build the Church in our midst and throughout our Diocese of Trenton. May our Stewardship of Time, Talent & Treasure continue to make the Church vibrant in our time. Have a great week. Let us remember one another in prayer. Happy Sunday. Peace.

### SPIRITUAL ADOPTION PROGRAM

Everyone loves the beauty and innocence of a baby. As an expression of that love, Saint Mary Parish members will soon have the opportunity to “spiritually adopt” a child who is newly conceived. On the weekend of September 12 & 13, 2015, packets containing knitted or crocheted blanket squares with a prayer card attached will be blessed at the 5:00PM Mass. They will then be available after each Mass to parishioners to begin praying over for nine months to spare the life of a newborn baby. At the end of the nine months, in June, 2016, the squares will be collected and knitted together for the baby blankets. A baby shower will be held at that time. Donated baby gifts and contributions will be collected at that celebration to be donated, along with the baby blankets, to a pregnancy center which helps mothers and their babies.

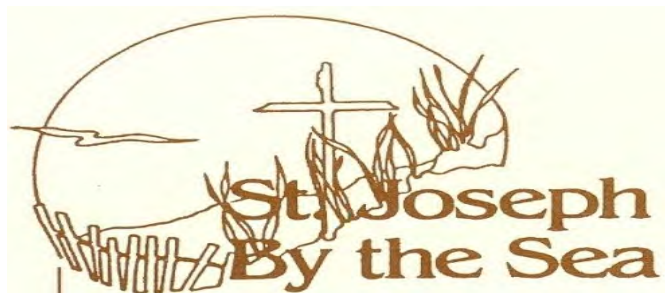
